The seventh annual UAB MTS (Math Talent Search) Contest took place on campus on Saturday, November 21, 2009.

Students began arriving at the Campbell Hall at 8:00 a.m. There were 153 students, grades 10 and 11, from 12 high schools participating. With coaches and chaperones, we had a crowd of 190 people. Students and guests were treated to donuts and cold drinks as they waited for the contest to begin.

At 9:00 a.m. students began the two hour test which was held in Business and Engineering Complex, and their teachers and chaperones enjoyed the hospitality room.

At 11:00, when the test was over, students and teachers were treated to pizza, cookies, other snacks, and cold drinks. The UAB math faculty and students began the challenging task of grading and judging the answers of the 153 students. The graders did an excellent job of determining winners. By 12:45pm the outcome of the contest was decided.

The Awards Ceremony began at 1pm with prizes presented by Dr Blokh as Dr Weikard read the list of winners. Schools who won the contest received trophies while the student winners received certificates and books about mathematics. The competition was rather tight, in particular we had a few ties.
