FALL 2011 UAB MATH TALENT SEARCH REPORT

The 10-th annual UAB MTS (Math Talent Search) Contest took place on campus on Saturday, October 29, 2011.

Students began arriving at the Campbell Hall at 8:00 a.m. There were 121 students, grades 10, 11, and 12, from 12 schools participating. With coaches and chaperons, we had a crowd of around 140 people. Students and guests were treated to cookies and cold drinks as they waited for the contest to begin.

At 9:00 a.m. students began the two hour test which was held in Business and Engineering Complex, and their teachers and chaperons enjoyed the hospitality room.

At 11:00, when the test was over, students and teachers were treated to pizza. The UAB math faculty and students began the challenging task of grading and judging the answers of the 121 students. The graders did an excellent job of determining winners. By 12:45pm the outcome of the contest was decided.

The Awards Ceremony began at 1pm with a talk by Professor D. Dolgopyat from University of Maryland sponsored by the Outreach Program of the Department of Mathematics of UAB. The talk was entitled **CONTINUED FRACTIONS** and was devoted to continued fractions a + (1/(b + 1/(c + 1/d + ...))) which provide a fun way to represent real numbers. Professor Dolgopyat compared continued fractions and standard decimal representations of real numbers (x = a + b/10 + c/100 + d/1000 + ...) and explained how to find a continued fraction representation of a given number. He also discussed which numbers have finite or periodic continued fractions.

Then various prizes were presented to winners by Dr Blokh as Dr Mayer read the list of winners. Schools who won the contest received trophies while the student winners received certificates and books about mathematics.
