The 18-th annual UAB MTS (Math Talent Search) Contest took place on campus on Saturday, November 9, 2019.

Students began arriving at the University Hall at 8:00 a.m. There were 152 students, grades 10, 11, and 12, from 10 schools participating. With coaches and chaperons, we had a crowd of around 170 people. Students and guests were treated to cookies and cold drinks as they waited for the contest to begin.
